This information relates only to students commencing a Commonwealth supported place in an undergraduate or graduate coursework degree in 2010* and should be read in conjunction with the *Information for Commonwealth Supported Students 2010* booklet.

Commonwealth supported students

2010 student contribution amounts

As a Commonwealth supported student your tuition costs are subsidised by the Australian Government. You will pay the contributions by subject in the disciplines specified in the following table. The student contribution you pay is based on the individual subjects chosen, not on the overall course. These contributions do not necessarily represent a typical enrolment as you may choose subjects from a range of disciplines throughout your degree. The amount you are charged is the sum of the contributions for all subjects in which you enrol. Accounting, administration, commerce, dentistry, economics, law, medicine, veterinary science	\$8,859	\$1,107

[^] 1 EFTSL (100 credit points) represents a standard annual full-time course load.

[~] The Commonwealth Government may introduce a Student Services and Amenities fee from 2010. Details of the fee will be provided after legislation has been passed and full details are known.

Example

Ashley is a first year, full-time student enrolled in a Commonwealth supported place in the Bachelor of Science. She enrolls in a total of 100 credit points, comprising eight subjects. One hundred credit points is equivalent to 1 EFTSL (equivalent full-time student load) at the University of Melbourne.

Each of Ashley's subjects is worth 12.5 credit points or 0.125 EFTSL. The subjects she enrolls in are across more than one discipline; six subjects in natural and physical sciences, one subject in humanities and one subject in built environment. Her student contribution for 2010 is calculated as:

$$(6 \times 0.125 \times \$4,249) + (1 \times 0.125 \times \$5,310) + (1 \times 0.125 \times \$7,567) = \$4,796$$

Eligible students may receive a discount for paying their student contribution amount up-front by the subject census date. * Students who began their course of study prior to 2010 may be eligible for different student contribution amounts to those listed above.

If you began your course of study prior to 1 January 2008 you may be considered a pre 2008 student.

If you began your course of study prior to 1 January 2009 you may be considered a pre 2009 student.

If you began your course of study prior to 1 January 2010 you may be considered a pre 2010 student.
