# Australian Students Studying Overseas

## 2018 Undergraduate Entry

If you're studying overseas, you may be taking courses we recognise for undergraduate course entry. Australian citizens, Australian permanent residents, New Zealand citizens or holders of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa may apply for a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP) at the University of Melbourne through the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC).

### When to apply

Timely applications for most courses close at the end of September for Semester 1 entry. Note: the Bachelor of Fine Arts - Animation, Dance, Film and Television, and Screenwriting have a timely application closing date at the end of August. Some courses also offer Semester 2 entry, and timely applications for these courses close in early June.

You must submit your final results, when available, to VTAC (not the University of Melbourne) as per the instructions on the VTAC website at:

Normally, selection is based on original or certified copies of final academic results.

When applying through VTAC, course codes that end in '1' reflect a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP).

### What it will cost

As a domestic undergraduate student you will enrol in a Commonwealth Supported Place, which is subsidised by the Australian Government.

You pay a student contribution, with the amount determined each year by the Australian Government, based on the subjects in which you enrol. The exact cost of your student contribution depends on the subjects you take, not the course you are studying.

Payment of the student contribution can be made upfront, or can be deferred through HECS-HELP for eligible students.

# AUSTRALIAN STUDENTS STUDYING OVERSEAS 2018

## When are offers made?

For Semester 1 entry, round one undergraduate offers are released in mid January each year.

For Semester 2 entry, round one undergraduate offers are released in mid July each year.

To accept your place, you must follow the instructions provided in the University's offer information which will be emailed to all successful applicants.

## When can I start?

Semester 1 commences in the week commencing February 26 in 2018.

All students should plan to attend Orientation Week in the week before commencement.

Semester 2 commences in the last week of July in 2018.

## What are the entry requirements?

Applications for Commonwealth Supported Places are generally considered on the basis of academic merit, the number of places available and the demand for the course. All applicants must satisfy course prerequisites. Eligible applicants may also receive consideration under Access Melbourne, the University's special entry scheme.

GCE A Levels and many other qualifications from around the world are also considered for admission to the University. In most cases, minimum admission requirements for domestic students are equivalent to the entry standards for international students. However, Commonwealth Supported Places are offered on the basis of academic merit, and the standard required to receive an offer may be higher than the minimum admission requirement, depending on the demand for the course and the number of Commonwealth Supported Places available.
